In this issue, we note the launch of the Level 8 Foundation Programme in Emergency Nursing, closing a missing link in the journey from interested student to expert emergency nurse. We continue to report ongoing QI work in EDs throughout the country and highlight the forthcoming EMS Gathering. Emergency Medicine is all about team-work and this is exemplified by the gathering that is the EMS Gathering, emphasising the complex interdependencies involved in ensuring the highest possible standard of delivery of care, irrespective of the stage in the chain of emergency care of any individual patient or how many patients are in need of care. This understanding and co-operation will be particularly relevant in preparation for the forthcoming mass "Mass" gathering of a heterogenous population in the Phoenix Park in a couple of weeks time.

Emergency Medicine Programme Report We welcome the inclusion of the Acute Floor proposal in Slaintecare, as a way of optimising patient flow in and around Emergency Departments in this time of increasing workloads, particularly presentations related to frailty, conditions requiring time-critical interventions and the roll-out of Trauma Networks.

Quality Improvement at the frontline

The Quality Improvement Division in collaboration with the Emergency Medicine Program continues to work with frontline staff in Emergency Departments. We are using an approach known as microsystems, which recognises that multi-disciplinary frontline teams are the ones best placed to identify and improve aspects of care in their work setting. The teams are all part of a collaborative which has allowed them to develop a network of improvers from emergency departments and all staff have put in enormous efforts over the last six months.

A recent Shared Learning Event -Celebration Day for the teams from the DML hospital group highlighted the variety of initiatives in the group. The day was widely supported by HSE staff and showed how ED staff respond to patient opinions and concerns. This work will be continuing in other hospital groups throughout 2018/2019.

Participants have stated "this approach is allowing us to change what is important to the patients who come to our department in a much quicker way than we would normally make changes ".
