MIMMs /HMIMMS







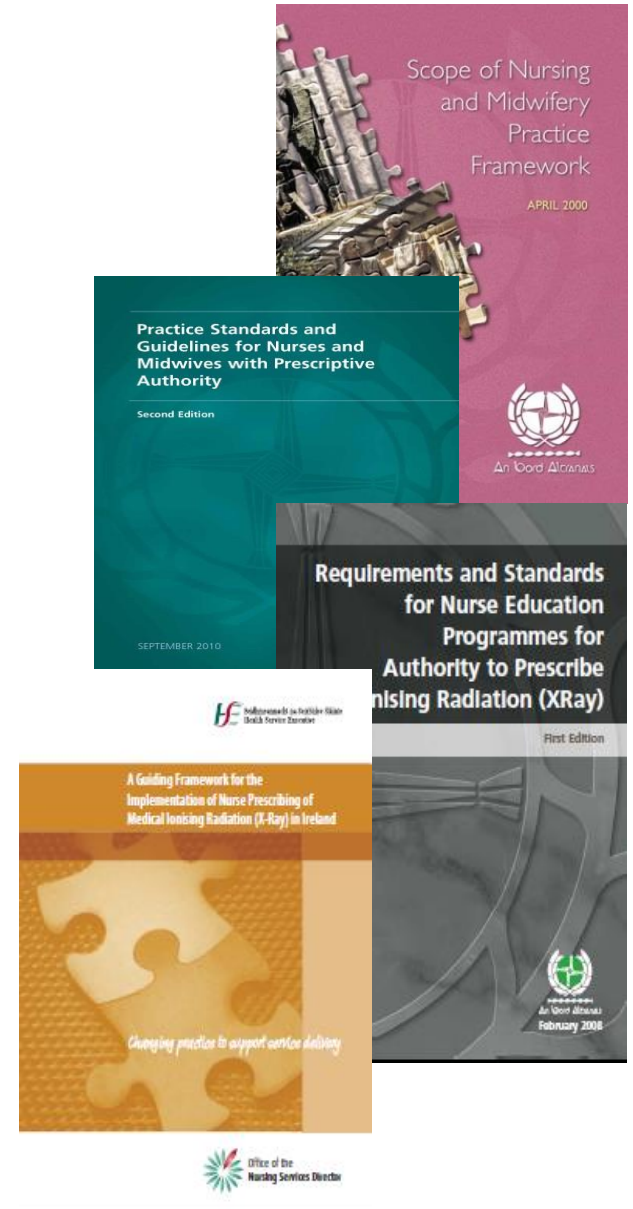
Scope of Practice Professional Development

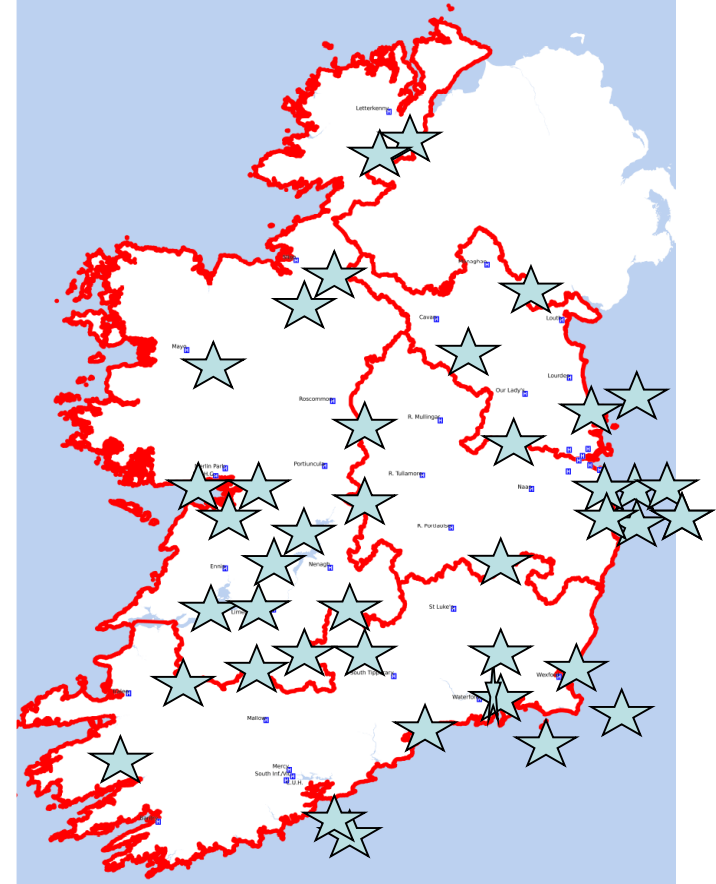

- Caseload = Injury & expansion to Med/Surg Mix



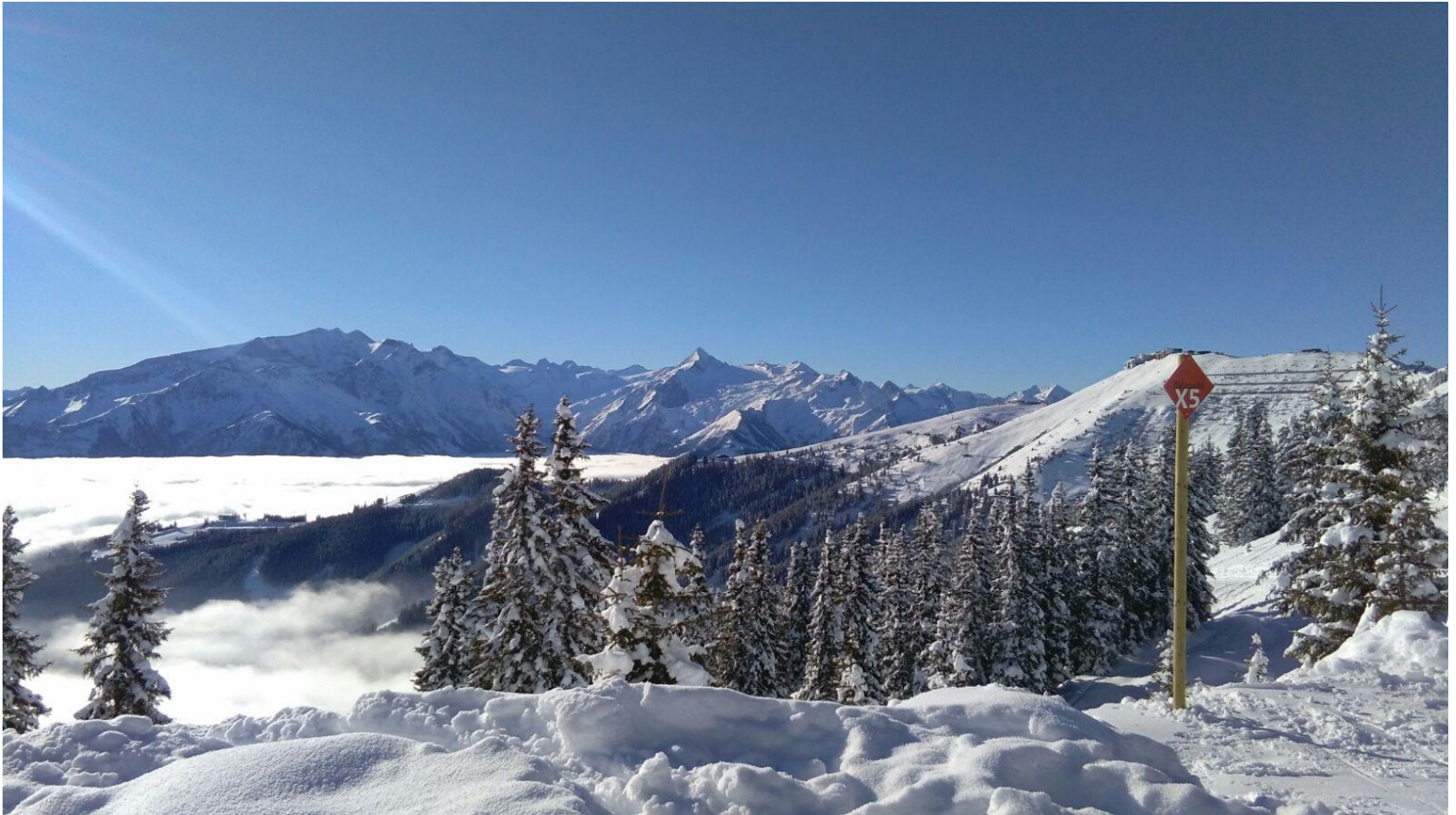
